Eucharistic Adoration is simply spending quiet time in the presence of Jesus. When Jesus was suffering His agony in the garden, He asked his apostles, "Could you not spend one hour with Me?" Jesus' lamentation touches our hearts, and we respond, "We can."

Adoration is for anyone who wishes to come. You do not have to be Catholic and there are no special requirements. Pope John Paul II would spend many hours in silent Eucharistic adoration and stated that the practice provides contact with the "very wellspring of grace".

Compline is an evening prayer, the final prayer in the Hours of the Divine Office. Although it originated in monasteries, it has become popular outside the monastery as well. Many find it to be surprisingly relevant for us in modern daily life.

Compline is a ritual that settles the mind and heart and serves as a peaceful connection between one day or week and the next.
