#### What is Rewilding, Anyway?

Rewilding is a (relatively) new approach to returning ecosystems to a more natural - or wilder - state. The idea is to get out of the way and let nature take over to create more biodiverse areas. Keystone species, those beings who have a large impact on an ecosystem, are often re-introduced. Fragmented habitats are reconnected creating wildlife corridors. Some remarkable transformations have taken place.

Did you know?

The monarch butterfly population in the U.S. has declined by more than 80% since the 1980's—mostly due to the loss of the monarch's only caterpillar host plant—the milkweed. Less milkweed = fewer monarchs.

Planting milkweed provides the habitat these beauties need. There are 12 native species to choose from. I have common milkweed in my yard and can vouch for the prettiness of the flowers and the sweetness of the fragrance they give off. Plus butterflies and lots of other happy pollinators!
